2016 Creative Scotland Open Project Funding award for artistic development to support this project

Exploring three-dimensional constructions using contemporary technologies and materials, Gray contributes to the corpus of contemporary constructed art. Digital combined with the hand made produces a specific aesthetic of making - a 'constructive' aesthetic. Drawing on concepts in architecture, mathematics and astronomy, her constructions use various geometries to explore ambigous forms and space, and our perception of these. Working mainly with perspex transparency, translucency, and opacity are important characteristics that can reveal, obscure and hide. The constructions are made using a desktop laser printer/cutter (*Glowforge*) allowing precision of line and finish. The laser printing/cutting usually takes only minutes, but the development of the digital cutting file (*Adobe Illustrator*) takes many many hours. The outcomes are forms that would be impossible to make by hand, although 'handling' finalises the arrangements.
